1967 – Present

Geoff's first show was in 1974 and has had some 80 exhibitions including 14/solo shows and selected for a number of commissions, an extensive collection of all his work from 1974 to the present is recorded on his website (see below). He is represented in these collections, Penrith and Bathurst Regional Galleries, The Dobell Collection, University of NSW and Macquarie University, Gadens Collection, Kuching Waterfront, Malaysia etc. Private Collections in Australia, USA and Europe.

2023 Church History Museum SLC USA purchased works, 2022 Guest Artist Sculpture in the Vineyards, Wollombi. Awarded the Tarana Art Prize for Portraiture 2017 and the Residency at Hill End NSW (Bathurst Regional Gallery 2016), the Tetsuya Wakuda Sculpture Prize, he also has won a number of awards including 2 Federal Government Visual Art Board Grants, the Dyson Bequest (Art Gallery NSW), Australian Government Tertiary Grant and the inaugural TAFE Fellowship and studied Fine Art Casting at the Johnson Atelier at Princeton, NJ,USA from 1982-3, receiving a Johnson Atelier Graduate Assistantship then lived in Utah working at the Wasatch Bronze Works and making a commissioned work. Highly trained in Bronze Fine Art Shell Casting over 30 years experience.

After Geoff's return from Europe in 2011, focused on miniature/ small works in painting landscapes and still life. Has had two solo shows in 2015 exhibiting these works. Another solo exhibition of landscape and still life paintings in November 2020. However, Geoff continued to work on his sculptures.

Travelled to Europe, UK and Asia in 1994 and again in 2001(on the NAS Research Travel Grant) Lived in Poland 2009 -11 stationed at Warsaw Poland volunteer LDS S&I Country Coordinators. Travelled extensively in Europe, Austria, Denmark, Romania, Italy, Germany, France, England, Scotland, Czech Republic, The Netherlands, Spain and Greece.

In 1967 Geoff was awarded the highly competitive Art Teachers Scholarship for 4 years, studying at the National Art School and Alexander Mackie Teachers College after which he began his career as an secondary school Art Teacher for some six years then as an Art Master at Canterbury Girls High School for a year. After which he taught Sculpture, drawing and Art History part time at a number of art schools and was appointed to the School of Art and Design East Sydney Technical College in 1979 teaching and administering the Sculpture Department for over 20 years. Also acted as Head and Senior Head Teacher at the NAS.

Then Geoff became the inaugural Head of Sculpture (independent) National Art School and Head of Studies (NAS) for 10 years where he was responsible for the overseeing of all the School's written syllabi and curriculum for both undergraduate; BFA and Postgraduate Degrees; BFA Honours, MFA and supervised and assessed MFA students.

Served on the finance committee and chaired numerous school committees including Heads of Department Committee and Academic Board. Acted as Director on many occasions. Served with the Director in reorganizing and initiating new studios throughout the heritage complex that is the National Art School which had been vacated by TAFE

Was instrumental in initiating that the National Art School to become an Independent Art School from TAFE. Constantly involved in high level political negotiations with both State and Federal Ministers and senior bureaucrats. A process that took many years but in 1997 became a reality.
